RIMPTA Training Announcement

80 Hour Basic Police Motorcycle Operators Course

Program Date:	June 4, 2018 - June 15, 2018 Monday – Friday
Time:	0730 – 1630 HRS (9 days) 1530 - 2330 HRS (one day TBD)
Location:	University of Rhode Island Ambulance Service Building 20 Tootell Road, Kingston, Rhode Island

This course is designed to teach prospective police motorcycle officers the skills required to enhance their safety on the road. Students spend most of the course riding the motorcycle with practical, real world scenarios and exercises and riding instruction, supplemented with classroom instruction and demonstrations of tactical techniques.

The goal of this program is to teach prospective officers the skills necessary to safely and effectively operate a police motorcycle while conducting daily police business in their community.

Topics to be covered include:

- Maintenance/Nomenclature
- Mounting/Dismounting, parking, picking up a fallen motorcycle, pushing the motorcycle
- Slow speed maneuvers
- High speed/Emergency braking
- Curb and obstacle negotiation
- Curve negotiation
- Vehicle Stops/Escort Procedures
- Night riding/Off-road riding
- Traffic Stops/Officer Safety

Target Audience: Permanent Police Officers who will be operating a department police motorcycle. Officers must be prepared for an 80-hour course that will be mentally and physically demanding. Officers will receive a certificate upon completing all training days. **Attendance is MANDATORY for all days of training.**

This training is offered free of charge. To register, please complete the attached registration form and fax or e-mail to Mrs. Donna Lavalley at (401) 722-3151, donna.lavalley@risp.gov by May 31, 2018. Attendance is limited to Twelve (12) officers. The Academy will notify each agency regarding seat allocations once all applications have been received. Department motorcycles will be securely stored indoors at the University of Rhode Island Ambulance Service Center for the duration of the training.

Special note: Students must sign a University of Rhode Island waiver of release, possess a valid Motorcycle Endorsement on their driver's license at the time of the training, and bring a well-maintained police motorcycle. We recommend servicing motorcycles by a licensed, certified motorcycle mechanic prior to the training to ensure the brakes, clutch, battery, and tires are in excellent working order. If a motorcycle becomes disabled during training, it will be that officer or officer's agency responsibility to make corrective action prior to continuing with the program.
