This two-hour workshop will introduce and update Patrol Officers, Supervisors, Detectives and law enforcement personnel to the New England High Intensity Drug Trafficking Area (NEHIDTA) Heroin Response Strategy (HRS) mission while stressing the potential benefits of information sharing among the law enforcement community.

New England HIDTA Vision Statement: Reduce drug availability by eliminating or disrupting drug trafficking organizations, reduce the harmful consequences of drug trafficking and improve the efficiency and effectiveness of law enforcement organizations and their efforts within the New England HIDTA.

Designated in 1999, the New England HIDTA provides funding resources, facilitates and enhances coordination of federal, state, and local law enforcement agencies in designated areas, enabling them to combine and leverage resources and capabilities to carry out activities to address the specific drug threats of those areas.

The New England HIDTA provides an agency-neutral program to balance regional law enforcement efforts and coordinates a strategy to address the regional threat and national priorities. It continues to foster effective working relationships among six U.S. Attorneys' Offices, nine Federal law enforcement agencies, and scores of State and local law enforcement agencies. The 18-member New England HIDTA Executive Board approves the Strategy, as well as the Threat Assessment, budget, and initiatives. New England HIDTA task force initiatives are staffed with collocated Federal, State, and local law enforcement officers.
