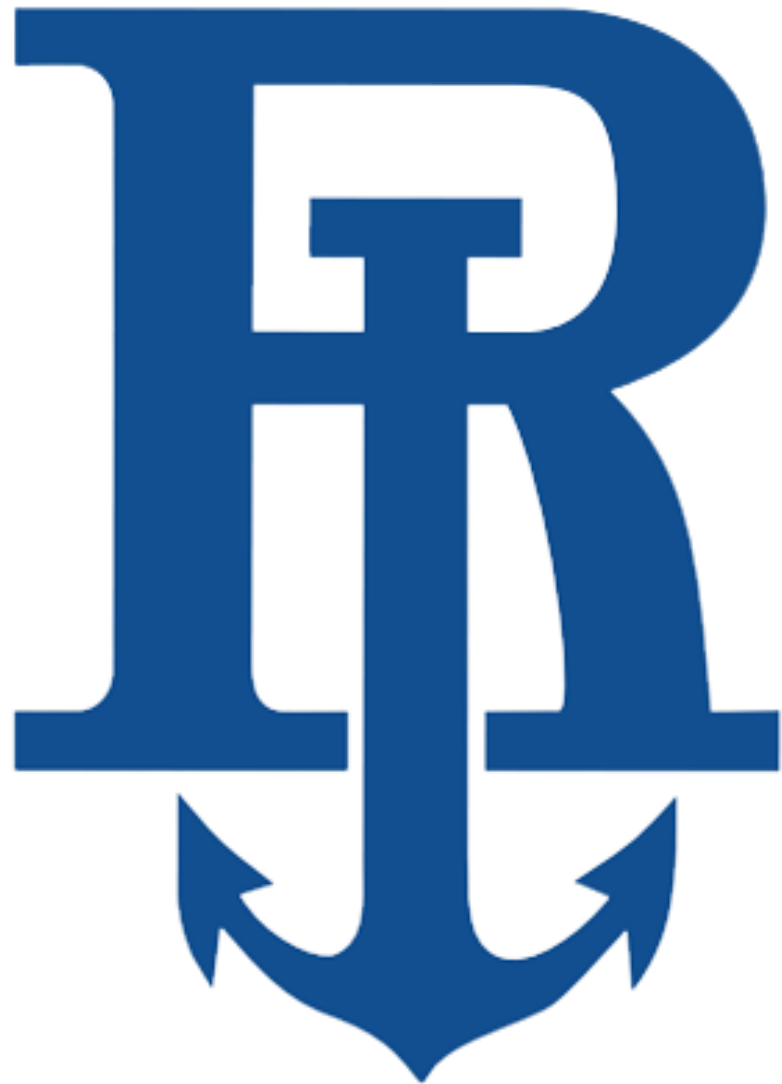

The Rhode Island Behavioral Health Medical Reserve Corps (RIBHMRC) TRAUMA RESPONSE TEAM (TRT) is a specialized unit established to provide prompt and efficient behavioral healthcare support in the aftermath of traumatic events. Grant funded by the Department of Behavioral Healthcare, Developmental Disabilities & Hospitals (BHDDH), this program recognizes the critical need to address the psychological effects of trauma and ensure that affected individuals receive timely care and support.

The TRT's mission is to fill a crucial gap in existing services by delivering behavioral healthcare support directly on the scene of traumatic events such as active shooter incidents, natural disasters, terrorist attacks, mass casualty incidents (MCI), or school based violence/traumatic loss. This proactive approach aims to address the immediate psychological needs of individuals impacted by trauma and bridge the gap between the event and ongoing behavioral healthcare.

Responding Effectively to Complex Incidents

MGT-308

An Incident Commander's (IC) mission is to ensure that incidents are managed as effectively and safely as possible. Complex incidents are particularly challenging to manage because they often evolve rapidly, involve significant hazards, and/or require innovative solutions. Complex incidents require a response from multiple jurisdictions/agencies, each of which may have a unique perspective when arriving on-scene. To effectively manage these incidents, the diverse response partners must act collaboratively, and this requires ICs to rapidly bring their differing response priorities, objectives, and strategies into alignment. This course discusses how to overcome the unique challenges that complex incidents present. Topics include the need to rapidly recognize the incident's magnitude and cooperate with other commanders, strategies for promoting interdisciplinary collaboration before an incident occurs, strategies for deconflicting competing priorities, how and when to establish a unified command, and how and when to transfer command.

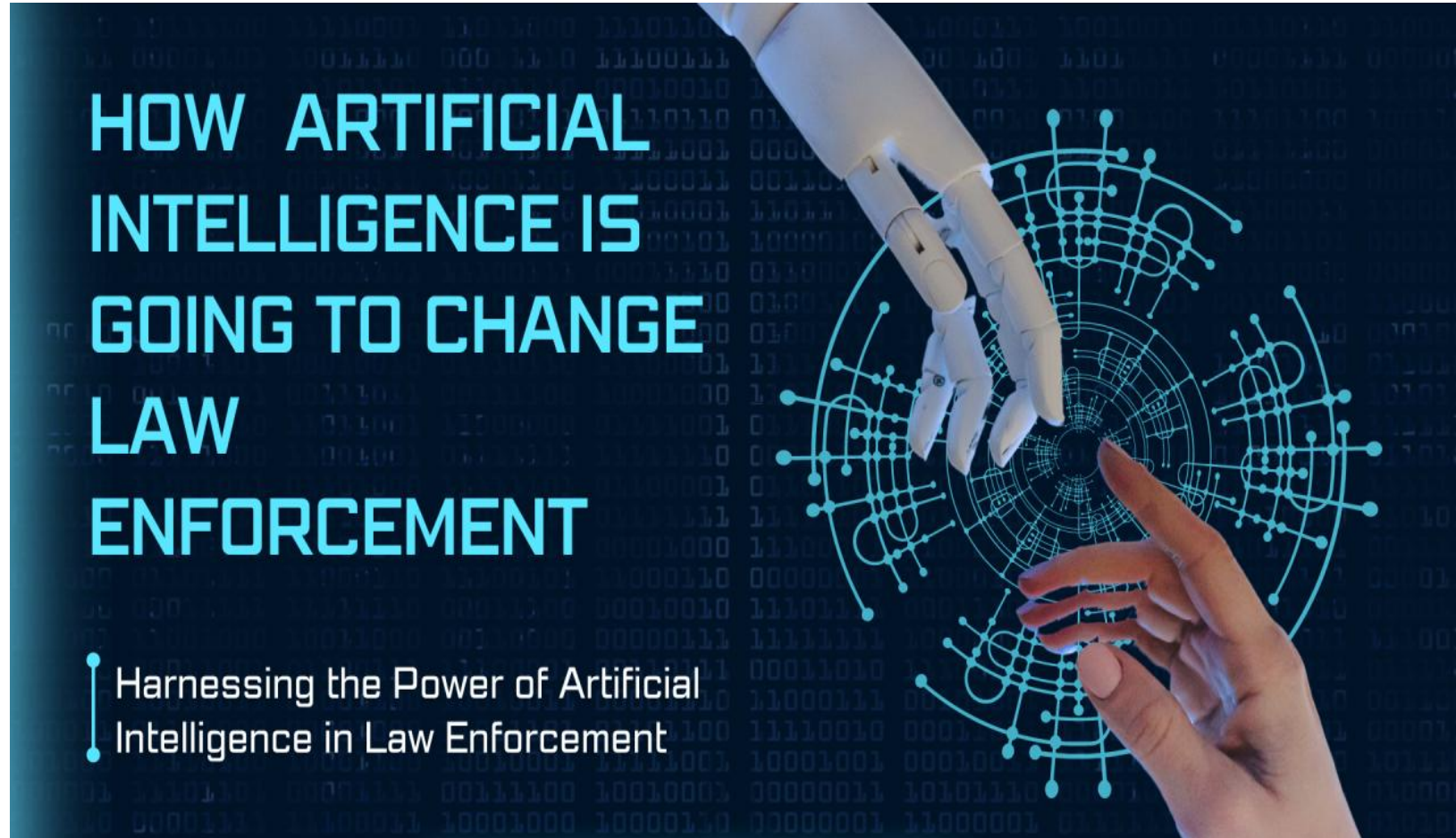

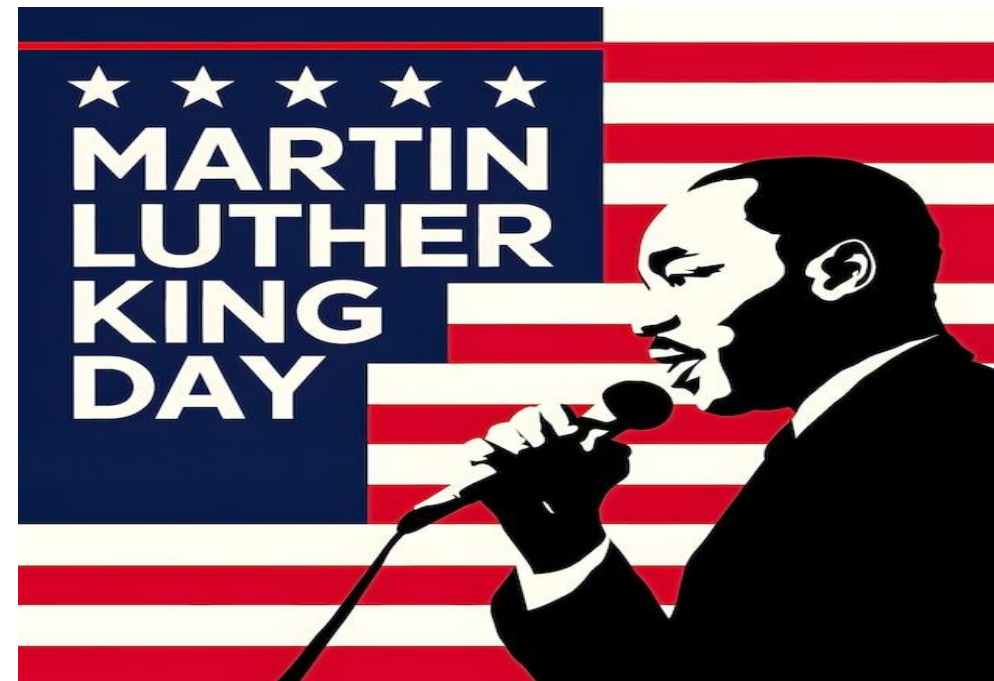

REPORT WRITING AND CASE REVIEW FOR LAW ENFORCEMENT SUPERVISORS



OVERVIEW

Among their many responsibilities, police supervisors must review and approve police reports. This requires their understanding of the critical information needed for each case and the risks associated with approving substandard reports.

Experience teaches that police reports are subjected to rigorous review and often, public scrutiny. Reports must convey information clearly and accurately. Relevant evidence must be described. Objectivity is vital. Facts, circumstances, and actions must be organized. Investigative steps must be specified. And so on.

In practice, comprehensive reports require more than an understanding law and procedure or investigative aptitude. They require organization and clarity to effectively communicate information to others. This starts with being aware of what is essential in each individual case. Police supervisors must ensure that those in their charge meet all applicable rules and standards – failing to do so can bring disciplinary action, reputational harm, and supervisory liability.

This course offers strategies for those in supervisory positions tasked with reviewing police reports. In doing so, it covers relevant law enforcement best practices, common legal principles, and methods for articulating information to ensure quality cases and effective police reports.

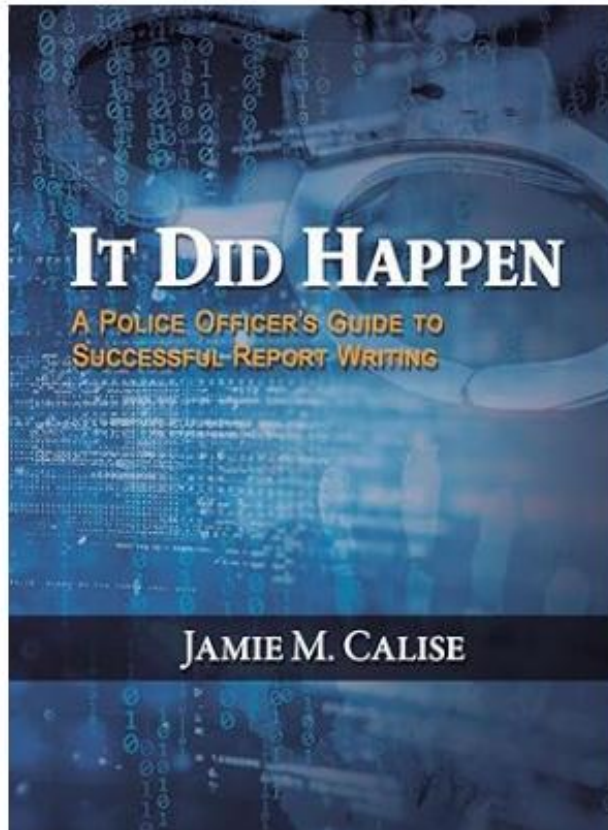

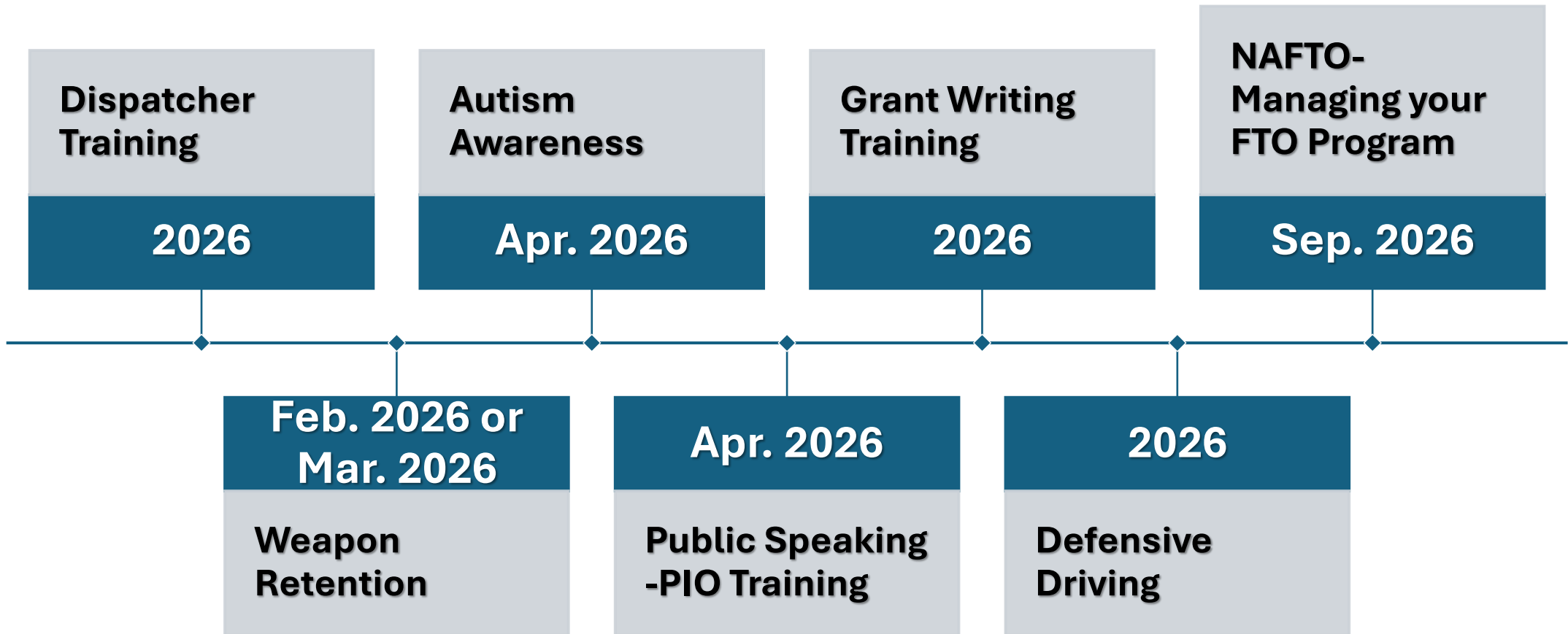

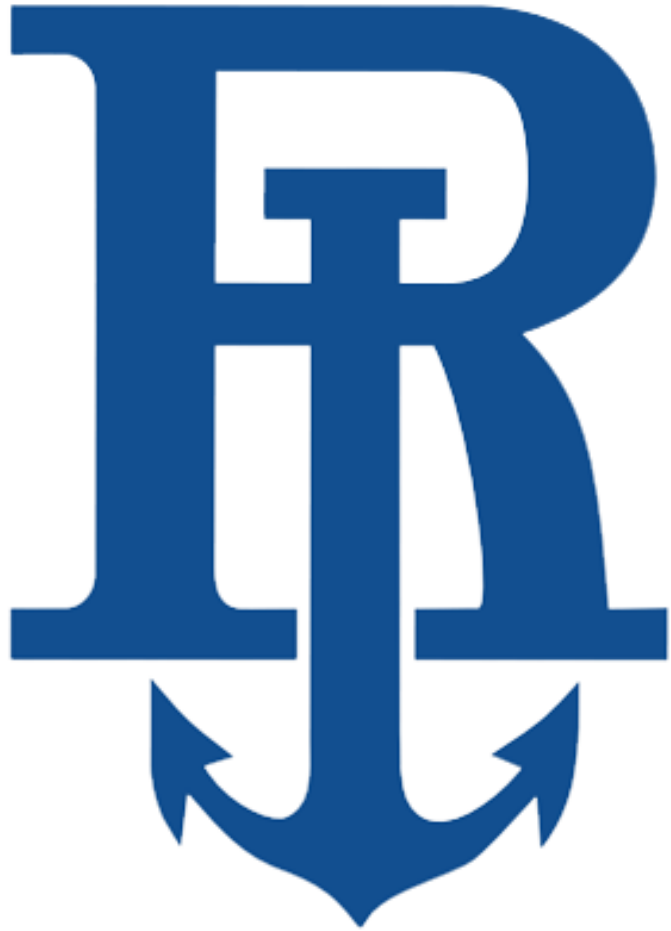
